Community Partners support Spindletop Center's essential projects

Client service areas and resources enhanced with local giving

BEAUMONT, TX – Spindletop Center received two local grant awards benefiting multiple programs. Facility improvements and repairs have been a strategic priority at Spindletop Center for the last several years due to aging infrastructure.

The Junior League of Beaumont awarded \$5,000 to help support an emergent HVAC repair on Spindletop Center's Beaumont North Campus. The building that required the repair facilitates various programs such as Early Childhood Intervention (ECI), Intellectual and Developmental Disability (IDD) Services, as well as 59 employees within our organization that utilize office space.

The HVAC units were showing age-related wear with deterioration of mechanisms within the unit. Spindletop Center was able to complete the necessary repairs so that our center could continue to operate the system safely. Providing services to individuals is more than having the tools and resources to effectively implement a program. It is essential that we provide a safe and comfortable environment for the people that we serve.

Additionally, the Southeast Texas Arts Council (SETAC) awarded Spindletop Center \$500 to purchase art supplies for our Peer Support Clients and Individuals with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD). Currently, Spindletop Center serves over 200 individuals in both programs combined within five counties, including Jefferson, Chambers, Orange, Hardin and Jasper. Each of these clients will have an opportunity to participate in various art projects throughout the year that promote emotional regulation, problem solving skills, skills training, and social interactions.

Using art, Spindletop Center can provide a therapeutic environment for these individuals that facilitate developing coping strategies and building confidence. With the support of SETX Arts

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Council, Spindletop Center was able to purchase playdough, paint, journals, vision board materials and much more, to aid in therapies and activities for 2026.

Each of these projects was made possible due to our generous community partners. “We are so grateful for our community partners and their willingness to continue to support our clients through special projects.
